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From The President's Desk

Dear Members,

I hope you are all enjoying the summer weather, time with your family, and perhaps some well-deserved relaxation. As we reach the midpoint of the year, I wanted to take a moment to connect with you and share some updates on our organization's progress and future plans.

On July 1st 2024, the Psychology and Behaviour Analysis Act, 2021 was proclaimed into law. This marks a significant milestone for behaviour analysis in Ontario and is the product of decades of advocacy, policy development, and hard work by dedicated ONTABA members like you! This change brings a regulatory college to oversee professional standards and public protection, new opportunities for collaboration with other regulated health professions, and enhanced accountability to ensure high-quality care for our clients. As regulated health professionals, behaviour analysts will now have increased recognition and credibility within the healthcare system, along with a clear scope of practice defined by law. I would like to thank the dedicated team at the College of Psychologists and Behaviour Analysts of Ontario for supporting the transition successfully, as well as the Ministries of Health and Children, Community, and Social Services for their support of the Act. Your hard work on this made the transition easy, and a reality.

Although July 1st has come and gone, our work related to regulation is not over. I am pleased to announce the creation of the Regulation Resource Task Force which will be led by long-time ONTABA member and former Director-at-Large, Carobeth Zorzos. The task force members include Drs. Joan Broto, Nancy Marchese, and Janet McLaughlin, as well as Aamir Khan, Jennifer Nieradka, and Kim Trudeau-Craig. We are extremely grateful to each of these dedicated volunteers who will lend their expertise at this pivotal time. I would also like to acknowledge Shannon Elliott for agreeing to be a liaison between ONTABA™ and the College of Psychologists and Behaviour Analysts of Ontario (CPBAO). I am confident that the positive and collaborative relationship we have built with the College will produce the best results for our members and the families we serve.

As you may know, in September 2023, in response to the Ontario-based regulatory system, the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB) announced significant changes for certificate holders practicing in Ontario. ONTABA recognizes not just the historical importance of the BACB certification in Ontario, but we are also looking to the future and we are actively exploring how we can best re-engage in meaningful discussions about the role of the BACB's certification system here in Ontario. While the situation is complex and the outcomes are uncertain, we are committed to advocating for solutions that best serve our members and the broader behaviour analytic community. We will keep our members informed of any significant developments as we continue our efforts.






